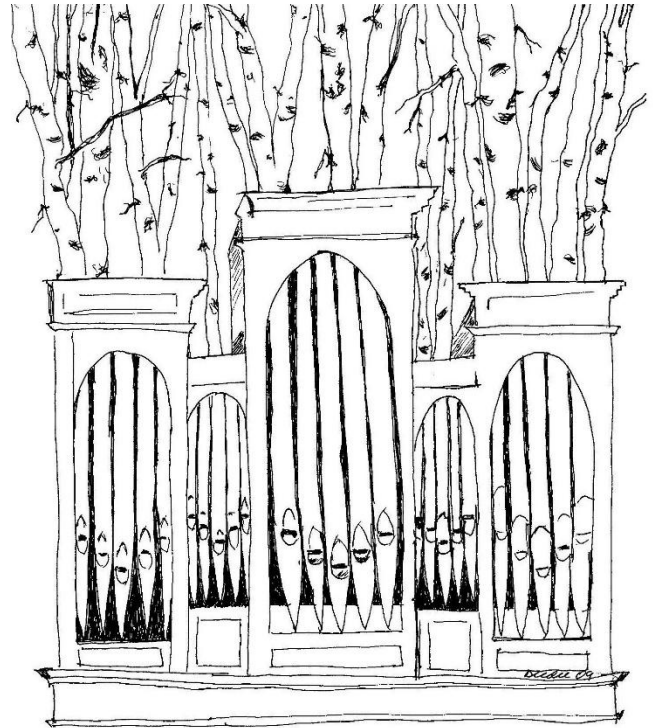


Wissinger Organ Specifications

Opus 12, Darron Wissinger Organs (Portsmouth, New Hampshire) was installed in 1992-93 to culminate the celebration of the 250th anniversary of Second Parish. It was dedicated to the memory of Donald and Carol Robinson, a beloved ministerial couple who served the church from 1957 to 1977. Barbara Owen served as consultant to the church and as tonal finisher.

The organ is comprised of 17 stops, 21 ranks and 1158 pipes, and has mechanical key and stop action with 56-note manuals and a 30-note, straight, flat pedalboard. A mechanically-operated, balanced swell shoe controls shutters which enclose all pipes of the Swell Division. A single wedge bellows provides wind pressure. The tuning temperament used is Kellner fifth-comma meantone. The casework was designed to complement meetinghouse architecture.
